

3. What is an experience that you have had during high school that has inspired or challenged you and has this allowed you to make positive contributions to those around you?

- 4. Please list activities that you have been involved in and any honors, awards, or special recognitions you have received in high school. These can be academic, athletic, civic, work-related, volunteer, hobby, etc. Please list the number of weeks you participate in these activities per year and the average hours per week. Feel free to use bullets. (Examples: Spanish Club, Member, 36 weeks, .5 hours per week or Dairy Queen, Front Counter, 52 weeks per year, 10 hours per week)
